Mrs. Farley informed the Council that she would like to implement a new payroll program from Keystone. The initial cost would be \$4,285.00 with a yearly maintenance fee of \$1650.00, the first year being prorated. After a short discussion, it was tabled for further review.

OLD BUSINESS

Capital Asset: Mr. Higgins gave a short explanation of SBOA requirements for capital assets and the need to improve the towns existing records. Mrs. Farley obtained 2 quotes for this service, Keystone and London Witte Group. After a short discussion, Mrs. Van Hook made a motion to accept the proposal from London Witte Group in an amount not to exceed \$5000.00. Mrs. Van Hook made a motion to approve the agreement from London Witte Group. Mrs. Price, Seconded.

Code Enforcement: The Council would like to continue to accept applications for the position until next meeting.

Weight and vehicle limitation: Council will identify allies and roads they would like to have a limitation on. Once this is determined Mr. Albright will put together a resolution.

Foreclosure: June 30th will be the deadline for objections. If no objections, the town will move forward.

ARP Reporting- After a lengthy investigation, Mr. Albright determined the signed ARPA ordinance would not need to be sent to the Federal Government.

Cameras: Due to available issues, Mr. Wells is unable to give pricing for the entire solution. He can rework things to include just equipment, that is or should be readily available. Council would like to move forward with this option.

Vandalism: Mrs. Farley has been in contact with the insurance company. It was determined that due to the amount of loss it should not affect our rates. They would like the police report and pictures. Mr. Dixon will contact them concerning this information.

Sewer Project Update: Mr. Dixon informed the Council that Watson Excavating is scheduled to start in the next few weeks.

NEW BUSINESS


Main St. Flowers: Mr. Dixon wanted to increase the appropriation from \$500 to \$700 this year. Mr. Bengel was in favor of keeping it \$500. Mrs. Van Hook made a motion to spend \$500 for flowers. Mrs. Price, Seconded and the motion carried.

Town Wide Rummage Sale: June 18th Mrs. Farley will advertise.

Fire Department Training: Mr. Dixon would like for the council to consider allowing the special teams unit from Noblesville Fire Department use the property located at St. Rd. 19 for a training event next year. This would involve not only N.F.D. but also Jackson Township and units from northern Hamilton Co. Council thought it would be a good idea.


Public Comment: Mrs. Teal enquired about the progress being made at 705 S. Indiana St. Mr. Dixon informed her that Mr. Emmert is working on this.

With no further business to discuss the claims were signed and the meeting adjourned.

Mrs. Farley reported:


- Confirmations are in the process of being sent.

- We have received a grant from Hamilton County Tourism in the amount of \$1500.00.
- We have contacted WNDX, WFMS and WWKI concerning promoting the festival.
- Living Proof and Cook and Belle have been scheduled for our 2 headliner bands.
- We are waiting to hear from Blain Maliber from the HCSD and Fire Chief John Moore from Jackson Township.
- The \$1000.00 scholarship was presented and will be mailed this week.
- Annie Dixon will work with Jaqueline Beeler concerning FB ads.
- We are waiting to hear back from Kahlo Jeep as a potential sponsor.
- The old tractors will be back again this year.

Mr. Farley also reported that we have been contacted by a wood chip vendor who will be doing demonstrations and would like to be near Main Street. The council decided to put him by the gazebo leading down to the park area. She will also contact NPE concerning parking at the high school and riding the train to the festival.
