Water, Wastewater, & Streets: Andy Emmert

No Report

Sewer Project

Mr. Emmert gave an update on the closing of the sewer project. He informed the council that Watson Excavating and ART are waiting on their final payments. Triad has not completed the as-builds. Mr. Dixon and an email that he had received from Triad stating they have a question concerning a change order, they are working on the as-builts and trying to complete everything on their end. Mr. Emmert will contact them to answer the question.

Water and Sewer Plant Roof Repairs

The council had approved repairs to the water plant several months ago, but the work was never completed. Mr. Emmert received 2 new bids concerning the water plant repair and wind damage repair to the sewer plant. The water plant has an issue with an aerator tank that would need to be sealed. Mr. Emmet contacted ART to make a permanent seal between the roof and tank. Their one-day rate is \$5000.00. After a short discussion, Mrs. Van Hook made a motion to accept both bids in the amount of \$23,000.00 (\$17,000.00 for the water plant and \$6,000.00 for the sewer plant) Mrs. Price, Seconded.

Water Tower

Mr. Emmert gave a quick update on the water tower painting. They should be done by the end of the week. They will be painting the tornado siren the same color. Omni Electric will install the siren at 60ft elevation after it has been painted.

Mr. Emmert received a notice from the state concerning high nitrate levels in the water. The reading was 7. It is normally around 2. With the high reading, we will need to do take quarterly readings for the next year.

Mr. Emmert informed the council that he attended a lead and copper class at his conference. There may be hanges coming, in the future, concerning this.

OLD BUSINESS

Library:

Mrs. Farley informed the council; the 2014 Water BOND pay-off was completed October 19th. The Council received a letter from the resident located at 220 S. Indiana St. concerning the sidewalk. (attached) After a short review of the situation Mr. Dixon is continuing to investigate the matter of repairing sidewalks in town, starting with a comprehensive plan.

NEW BUSINESS

Resolution R-10-2023-01: A Resolution Declaring Dormant Fund Account. Mrs. Farley explained the Sewer Money Market fund has less than \$10,000 in the account therefore it has been receiving a service charge each month which is then refunded. She would like to transfer this into our sewer operating fund which would eliminate the hassle of having it refunded each month. After Mr. Dixon read the attached Resolution Declaring the Sewer Money Market Fund dormant, Mrs. Van Hook made a motion to accept the resolution. Mrs. Price, Seconded.
