# **OLD BUSINESS**

Utility District: Mr. Dixon and Mr. Emmert have met with two different law firms regarding forming a utility listrict. Both estimates were between 25,000 to 100,000. The lowest estimate was with Carson LLP in the amount of \$5,000 to 10,000. Mr. Dixon stated that a good place to begin this process would be with the

zoning jurisdiction. He will have an engagement letter for the Council and attorney's review for the next meeting.

# **NEW BUSINESS**

**Executive Session:** Mr. Dixon apologized for the error regarding the Executive Session that was scheduled prior to the Council Meeting. ### **Public Comment:**

Resident Nick Lynch addressed the Council with his opinions regarding the current circumstances involving Mr. Emmert. Mr. Lynch brought up various concerns including the published deposition, the bad publicity and potential stain on the Town. Mr. Lynch spoke up again later to make a comment regarding the family of the deceased that lives in Town. He also asked about park mulch and the library light post.

Resident Neila Teal voiced to the Council saying she believes Mr. Emmert has always fulfilled his duties and should be innocent until proven guilty. She stated that she does not think that any dislike of Mr. Emmert should determine their decision.

Resident Angie Van Hook posed some questions to the Council regarding Mr. Emmert's position, Mr. Brown's training, and the water operations.

Resident Bill Malott expressed his concerns about paid leave for Mr. Emmert. Regardless of the accusations, Mr. Malott stated that he cannot see how the Town can afford the cost of another paid leave. Inquiries about the Executive Session ending time were made by Mr. Malott as well.

Councilman Farly thanked everyone for their questions, comments, and cordial attitudes during this time.

With no further dusiness to discuss, the claims were signed and the meeting adjourned.
